Summary

We have reviewed the decision notice for DM/23/2687 and note that the following conditions require submission of the specified documents:

- Condition 18: details of a hard and soft landscaping scheme

- Condition 20: a Biodiversity Enhancement Layout
- Condition 21: a lighting scheme for biodiversity

In addition, Condition 19 requires compliance with the LPA Ecological Response (David Archer Associates, November 2023) and Preliminary Ecological Appraisal (David Archer Associates, April 2023).

Section 4 of the Supporting Statement (Neil Pike Architects, July 2025) mentions an accompanying detailed landscape plan, but this does not appear to be available on the website. Therefore, we recommend that details of planting schedules and specifications should be supplied.

As none of these documents have yet been submitted, we look forward to reviewing them when they become available. However, it is acknowledged that this may be issued via separate discharge of condition applications.
