#### Summary

An archaeological watching brief was undertaken at Baldwins, Keymer, Hassocks during groundworks associated with the construction of a new dwelling. During the watching brief a large assemblage made up of pottery and glass was recovered, this all dated to the post-medieval period; a small number of prehistoric worked flints were also recovered.

The only feature identified was a modern brick built soak-away.

An evaluation of some 19th century outbuildings at Baldwin's, Keymer was undertaken.

The evaluation identified 3 buildings that had been built during the latter half of the 19th century.

Only one of the buildings were seen to have intrinsic value.
