Comments:	Part of the development is in a conservation area that was set up over 40 years ago to protect the historic character of the village- this will ruin it. The buildings that are recommended for demolition are in daily

use and lie within the conservation area. THEY ALSO HOUSE BATS, which I have videos of and you are welcome to come and see for yourself. An Ecologist, Sam Watson, was supposed to visit us on site on 13/10/2025, but failed to arrive.

The proposed entrance is opposite the village school on a very busy road, and this will only add further congestion to the already overused crossroads just yards away.

The entrance is also through some historic sandstone rock. 50 yards away on the same side of the road the soil is considered to be of specific scientific importance, and as we are on the high ridge, I can only assume these rocks are linked.

The local infrastructure is already overwhelmed. The school is very close to capacity, the local Doctors surgery is overstretched and we are currently living in a drought. More housing will only place even more pressure on local supplies.
