Comments:	<p>I write to comment on an application to convert a horticultural shed at Slaugham Garden Nursery to a residential dwelling. I object to the development for the following reasons:</p> <p>(DP16) The site is isolated from the village community, with no footpaths from the site. It is not pedestrian friendly. Being outside the settlement pattern I do not believe housing is an appropriate use of the horticultural site.</p> <p>(DP15)The proposed dwelling is not in keeping with other</p>

properties nearby and will do nothing to enhance the AONB. Any suggestion the application should be permitted in order to tidy what is now an eyesore when it is the owner who has caused it to become so would be reward for his lack of care for the site.

Having stated the site would be improved he has demonstrated awareness it has become so neglected. The site could be much improved without the development, if the owner had a mind to.

Given the long history of unsuitable applications for this site it is difficult to take it at face value. The housing is not demonstrably needed so begs the question why.
