Proposal: Outline application (appearance, landscaping, layout and scale reserved), for the erection of up to 200 residential dwellings, including affordable housing; a community building (use class F1) encompassing land for education provision, together with associated access, ancillary parking and landscaping; the creation of a vehicular access point from the A272 Cowfold Road, and pedestrian and cycle only access to The Street; and creation of a network of roads, footways, and cycleways through the site; together with the provision of countryside open space, children's play areas, community orchard, and allotments; sustainable drainage systems and landscape buffers.

[REDACTED] I live in Bolney and I love it here. I want to say why I think the plan to build 200 houses at Foxhole Farm is a bad idea.

1. The Roads Are Already Scary
I walk to school with my mum and sometimes ride my scooter. The roads are small and cars go fast. If you build more houses, there will be too many cars and lorries. That is not safe for

children like me. We might get hurt just trying to go to school or the park.

2. There Will Be Too Many People in School

My school is fun but small. We don't have many classrooms or teachers. If lots more children come, we won't all fit. There won't be enough chairs, pencils, or space to run around. I think children should have room to learn and play.

3. The Fields Are for Nature, Not Houses

Foxhole Farm is where I've seen deer, birds, and even a fox once. If you turn it into roads and buildings, they will all go away. Where will they live then? Trees and animals are important and we're meant to look after them.

4. Bolney Will Feel Too Full

I like that Bolney is quiet and friendly. If you put 200 more houses here, it will feel like a town, not a village. There will be more noise, more people, and less room for playing. I don't want Bolney to stop feeling like home.

Please don't build these houses. I want Bolney to stay safe, green, and special.
