Summary

We have reviewed the Dormouse Survey Report Version 01 (Deepdene Ecology, October 2025), Bat Survey – 2024 Activity Surveys (The Ecology Partnership, July 2025) and Preliminary Ecological Appraisal and Biodiversity Net Gain Assessment (The Ecology

Partnership, September 2025), relating to the likely impacts of development on designated sites, protected & Priority species and habitats, and identification of appropriate mitigation measures.

We have also reviewed the information submitted to meet the requirements of mandatory biodiversity net gains, which includes the Preliminary Ecological Appraisal and Biodiversity Net Gain Assessment (The Ecology Partnership, September 2025) and Statutory Biodiversity Metric (September 2025).

In addition, we have reviewed the further information submitted on the 1st and 2nd December 2025, which includes the amended site plan.

We are still satisfied that sufficient ecological information is available and recommend that our comments issued on the 14th December 2025 should still be followed for this application.

However, please note that we have no comments to make on Great Crested Newts as we have been instructed by the Council to leave comments on this European Protected Species to the NatureSpace Partnership.
