I've been told the houses on the development opposite have not all been sold yet, is there a demand for these houses?
It is really difficult to exit our road (hurstwood lane) onto fox hill, this will add substantial traffic to the area in the mornings / rush hour
Our garden gets very saturated during wet weather, I am worried about how this will affect our flood risk.
