roundabout at the junction of church road and paddockhurst road would help with the flow into the Village and allow easier crossing to the Church. This does not help the Village center and with the housing development this will add more traffic.

The ongoing need for social housing is understood but there needs to be housing appropriate for disabled families, there are none in Mid Sussex now. There is a family living in Withypitts Turners Hill, where twin boys are disabled, one with an electric wheelchair who is totally dependent, and the mother who is also disabled, they currently live in a flat, and are unable to access the shop and park.
