Comments:	This is regarding applications DM/25/0014, 0015,0016 & 0017. I object to the access to these proposed dwellings from

Wychwood Place. This is a private road (not managed by the council - we have to pay a maintenance fee each year) and is only fit for the amount of properties developed here already. The access from Turners Hill Road into the development is not designed for the amount of traffic we are likely to see. Not only that the road is not wide enough with some blind bends where cars are already parked on the road, giving only enough access for one car to pass. The increase in traffic is likely to cause accidents, especially on the bends.

In addition, what are the proposals for another doctor's surgery? The one we have in Crawley Down is already over populated and is difficult to often get an appointment resulting in going out of area to see one, which clearly is not ideal. This will only get worse.

Infrastructure also needs to be thought about carefully. We often receive power cuts in the area due to this very reason, so adding more into dwellings to this area will only make that more frequent.
