Proposed erection of estate barn to assist with operation of events venue and retained agricultural land. Creation of new vehicular access onto Bob Lane and provision of driveway and parking area, plus ancillary infrastructure including surface and foul water drainage strategy. I write to object to the above proposal for a wedding venue in this location.

Traffic

Bob lane was historically an adequate route to a small number farms and homes. The construction of additional properties combined with more frequent home deliveries is already making the lane hazardous. The large sporadic use of the lane to serve a wedding venue would add significantly to this risk.

Noise.

I am the owner of the cottages to the South East of the proposed venue. These properties have served the locality and farming industry in peace and quiet for over a hundred years. Clearly there would be frequent and intrusive noise generated not only from music but from the egress of guests, staff and service vehicles at unsocial hours. I am concerned this would severely adversely impact the quiet enjoyment of these nearby homes.
