Both my wife and I would like too very strongly object to the planning applications listed above on the Turners Hill Road , Crawley Down.

The following is a list of our main objections but as we are sure you are extremely busy we won't list every single one on our list.

SUSTAINABILITY.

How can this proposal fit the MSDC aims sustainably and protecting the people both in and close to the Crawley Down areas. If this is no longer a priority of planning it should be.

It has now been impossible to get an appointment at Modality health centre in Crawley Down and associated practices East Grinstead. The option provided again and again is to travel to Reigate Hospital Casualty. The stress and constant fear of a life threatening situation requiring referral by a doctor is too much to handle . Any of the proposed developments will only make this situation much much worse.

The village School has now been over prescribed for many years and unfortunately families are left with no option but to drive long distances to find a school with availability. Both from what should be our aim in life to be green and save the planet for those that follow us and to look after the welfare of families any unnecessary increase in population should automatically cancel any of these developments.

The Turners Hill Road is already extremely busy with long queues now occurring outside of the rush hours. Having lived for over thirty on the road where the development is planned any increase in population without further improvements on this and other connecting roads to control traffic flow should be unacceptable.

The tiny village groceries shop is far too small to cope with additional numbers and already requires the majority of villagers to drive to larger stores to buy essentials . Not

again good for the plant and again these proposed developments significantly make this matter worse.
