Comments: I would like to object to the planning application for the following reasons
Over development of our village - Our village has already been

massively developed with little to no improvements to the amenities within the village. There are always promises of money for local improvements and community projects yet I am unaware that this has ever materialised.

Lack of infrastructure - The previous developments have placed increased demand on water, power and communication services within the area yet no improvements have been made to these services.

Increased traffic - This development will greatly increase the number of cars within the area. The local roads are already overwhelmed and as for their condition, this will only get worse with the increase of HGV's for the building process and then additional residents cars. The road junction at Felbridge where the A264 meets the A22 has already been surveyed and confirmed to be operating at over capacity with additional local developments putting even more strain on this one junction.

GP surgeries - Anybody living locally will comment on the fact that it is near enough impossible to gain access to GP care, the existing surgery is already over capacity with difficulty getting additional staff.

Schools - Local primary schools are full with some local children having to go far afield to be able to access educational services
All in all, more houses will simply compound the above issues just for financial gain of developers and governments. This will have no benefit to the local community.
