As a resident of Yewhurst Close, I strongly object to access via this route. There is already insufficient parking for visitors, and it is constantly used as a 'parking area' and 'turnaround' for parents at the village school, which causes a traffic backlog and dangerous traffic problems at these times. We currently have a blind person living on the estate, as well as disabled persons, and animals; and more traffic would certainly cause safety problems, as well as to younger children resident on the estate who play in the cul-de-sac.

The constant noise and disturbance from lorries during the works will also cause significant disruption.

I am sure that an alternative access could be achieved.
