Comments:	To whom it may concern, I wish to object to the proposed development DM/25/2478 on the following grounds: Impact on local wildlife: The area in question serves as a small but important haven for

local wildlife, including birds, small mammals, and other species that rely on the natural vegetation and open space. Development of this land would destroy or significantly disrupt this habitat, contributing to the ongoing loss of biodiversity in the area.

Flood risk and water drainage:

The site regularly experiences flooding, particularly during heavy rainfall. Water flows downhill from the proposed location and collects along the bottom of Wealden Way which already causes issues for nearby residents. When it floods, access through to Bolnore and Ashenground woods is not possible, and neither is the available parking there. Further development and hard surfacing will only worsen runoff and increase the flood risk to existing homes.

Parking and traffic concerns:

Parking in this area is already extremely limited for residents and visitors. Additional dwellings or facilities will inevitably increase parking demand and congestion, making it even more difficult for current residents to park near their homes.

For these reasons, I believe the proposed development would have a negative impact on both the local environment and community, and I respectfully ask that the application be refused.
