Comments:	DM/25/2634 I object in the strongest possible terms to the above planning application, which is totally inappropriate. - It would require the destruction of old established trees and

hedgerows which are an important characteristic of the locality, and which are home to a great deal of wildlife.

- It is inexplicable that two entrances/exits to the site would be needed. It is totally inappropriate on this stretch of the Keymer Road.

- Access for vehicles in and out of the site would be extremely dangerous because of the limited sight lines in both directions. As a resident of Broadlands, I can confirm that exiting in a vehicle onto Keymer Road is already dangerous. It can only be achieved by nosing out until a full view can be seen, and dropping back if there is anything coming. This development will further complicate this process, and add even more traffic to a narrow country road that is already very busy, particularly at peak times.

- Pedestrian access would also be unacceptably dangerous, as pedestrians would have to cross the Keymer Road to access the pavement. The proposed crossing is far too close to Yondover and the entrance to Broadlands, and will create further problems for the existing residents of Broadlands, Keymer Road itself, and Greenlands Drive, as well as endangering the pedestrians themselves.
