Issacs Lane side of Burgess Hill. There are also numerous new developments on the Hassocks side of Burgess Hill. The centre of the town has been decimated due to the previous actions of the local councils. The new secondary school proposals have been cancelled causing a huge loss to the County Council. The existing transport infrastructure is poor with limited parking at Hassocks and Burgess Hill train stations and less than hourly buses to Crawley and Brighton as the nearest major places. You will already be aware of the pressure that the existing house building programme is putting on local health services. If more homes are needed they should be built in the town which has more than enough derelict or empty sites and not further out of town which will increase further the amount of traffic on a relatively minor road.
