Dear Sirs,

I wish to object in the strongest terms to the proposed development of the land at Foxhole Farm.

I am sure the many reasons why this is unsuitable have been brought to your attention by others living in the village so I would like to concentrate on just one aspect, the large increase in traffic that would no doubt occur on the lanes at the north end of the village, Lodge Lane, Top Street and Cherry Lane with their easy access to the A23.

My house is situated on the corner where these lanes meet so I am very aware of activity in this part of the village. These are narrow twisting lanes used by walkers, children walking to and from the village primary school and the play area by Rawson Hall, as well as people walking their dogs and residents out and about. Top Street and Cherry Lane in particular are narrow to drive along due to parked cars, both residents and visitors to activities at the Village Chapel. These lanes are totally unsuited to the large increase in traffic that would no doubt occur as residents living in the proposed new houses use them as the quickest and easiest way to access the A23 going north.

I expect some members of the Council are familiar with the village but I respectfully ask those who are not to come to the village, preferably at commuter time, look at the proposed site, drive round the lanes, attempt to get out onto the A272 from the south end of The Street and see for yourselves the problem that hundreds of additional cars would cause should permission be granted.
